We, at SA.MAST, would like to extend our heartfelt gratitude for your generous donation of 2 x Bronze 700 series horizontal sliding windows to the value of 4,446.00 on 26<sup>th</sup> March 2015.

Your donation of these windows will be used in the construction of the animal hospital we are building in Khayelitsha, which is so needed within and for this community. Our clinic is currently only equipped for a mass animal sterilisation programme and our ambulance is also forced to travel far distances to secure medical treatment, often resulting in three hours of travelling to help just four patients at a time.

The establishment of this hospital is therefore vital for many reasons, to list just a few:

- 1) We will be in a position to expand our free sterilisation service to the residents of this community - thereby addressing this huge animal overpopulation epidemic and radically reducing the number of unwanted litters born into communities that are unable to support and care for them.
- 2) It will result in fewer dangerous, sick and diseased animals mixing with the human population and so a positive influence on the human health and safety status can be achieved.
- 3) The important issue of Zoonosis (infections and diseases passed from animal to human), its causes, treatments and preventative measures can be emphasised.

Once again we are enormously grateful for your donation, as well as for your concern and compassion shown towards the health and welfare of the Khayelitsha community. We will endeavour to continue to earn your support now and in the future.
